*In Congressional District 10:*

**180,116**  
people are on Medicaid

**120,020**  
rely on SNAP to help put  
food on the table

*In all of Pennsylvania:*

**2.98 Million**  
people are on Medicaid

**2.01 Million**  
rely on SNAP to help put  
food on the table

### *Under the Republicans' plan to cut Medicaid and SNAP...*

*In Congressional District 10:*

**32,267**  
will have their Medicaid  
access stripped away

between  
**24,136 – 66,373**  
will be cut off from  
SNAP benefits

*In all of Pennsylvania:*

**538,000**  
will have their Medicaid  
access stripped away


between  
**400,000 – 1.1M**  
will be cut off from  
SNAP benefits

**Slashing Medicaid funding  
could force hospitals to  
close.**

Almost two-thirds of  
Pennsylvanians will benefit  
from Medicaid at some point  
in their lives.

Yellow dots show hospitals in each  
district. Many of these hospitals,  
***especially in rural areas***, may  
close if Medicaid is deeply cut.




Percentage of Pennsylvanians in each congressional district  
who receive Medicaid at any one time.

Legend: Dark Blue = Above 30%, Medium Blue = 20% - 25%, Light Blue = 10% - 15%, Yellow = Hospitals  
Medium Blue = 25% - 30%, Light Blue = 15% - 20%

**The Republicans are proposing to cut Medicaid and SNAP to offset the cost of extending and expanding Trump's 2017 tax giveaway to corporations and the ultra-rich.**

Half of the tax benefits would go to the richest 5%.

**Voters in Pennsylvania want to raise taxes on the rich – not cut them.**

Voters in Congressional District 10 overwhelmingly want the rich to pay more in taxes and larger tax credits for working families...

Likely Voters in Congressional District 10 Response	Topline
Profitable corporations are not paying enough in state taxes.....	73%
The wealthiest households are not paying enough in taxes.....	73%
Taxes should be increased for households earning more than \$400,000/year	74%
Child tax credits should be increased.....	70%

...and voters across Pennsylvania agree.

Profitable corporations are not paying enough in state taxes.....	76%
The wealthiest households are not paying enough in taxes.....	76%
Taxes should be increased for households earning more than \$400,000/year	77%
Child tax credits should be increased.....	72%
